Goals and Objectives

UNDERSTAND anatomy and pathophysiology of the palate and pharynx in cleft-related speech disorder

IDENTIFY impact of sinuses, hearing ability and tonsils/adenoids in cleft-related speech disorder

REVIEW methods of analysis of speech disorder, both perceptually and endoscopic/radiographically

DELINEATE age-specific and disorder-specific focus of speech therapy

PERFORM real-time therapeutic techniques

OBSERVE through a closed-circuit system children with cleft speech disorder undergoing evaluation and treatment with an international expert in the field

IDENTIFY specific genetic abnormalities associated with poor speech outcomes

KNOW when surgical treatment is necessary and determine correction technique

IDENTIFY barriers to care within this region and receive information and contacts to access for your patients

SIT IN ON a multidisciplinary team meeting to discuss individual cleft care recommendations
