PURPOSE: Based in Madison, WI, Dr. Ingraham aims to improve care coordination, quality, and delivery at the individual, hospital, and general population levels through a combination of medical expertise, empathy, and mastery of healthcare workflow. Her interests span clinical and non-clinical environments. Known for promoting communication and teamwork among diverse groups, she is a highly accomplished, double-board-certified general surgeon and surgical intensivist with extensive clinical, research, and quality improvement experience.

EXPERIENCE: As an Assistant Professor at the University of Wisconsin (UW)-Madison Department of Surgery, Dr. Ingraham delivered evidence-based care to trauma, burn, surgical, and critical care patients. She served as the Associate Medical Director for the Emergency General Surgery Program, initiating transformative projects, including a hospital-wide rapid response system and standardized care protocols.

Dr. Ingraham advanced the delivery of services as part of the UW Health COVID-19 Critical Care Team, ensuring physicians unfamiliar with acute care surgery delivered optimal care. She authored primers, developed checklists, and disseminated knowledge through articles, presentations, and videos.

Furthermore, she established and leads a multi-disciplinary health services research program focused on interhospital transfers, securing over \$1.1M in funding from the Agency for Healthcare Research & Quality (AHRQ) and the National Institute on Aging (NIA), authoring 60+ peer-reviewed publications.

LEADERSHIP & DEVELOPMENT: Her active involvement in professional organizations like the American College of Surgeons (ACS) and the American Association for the Surgery of Trauma (AAST) spans various leadership roles, including serving on the executive committees of the ACS Surgical Research Committee and the Surgical Outcomes Club. Dr. Ingraham's selection for executive development and leadership programs, including the Weikel Leadership and Engagement Across Disciplines of Surgery (LEADS) initiative, underscores her commitment to leadership and professional growth.

RECOGNITION: Notably, Dr. Ingraham applied for and received prestigious awards such as the National Institutes of Health (NIH) Loan Repayment Program Award and the Executive Leadership Program in Health Policy and Management at Brandeis University Scholarship.
